Interactive Digital Activities on the Text "Lorenzo Milani as a Pioneer of Inclusion in Italy"

1. Virtual Time Travel about Lorenzo Milani

Description: Create an interactive timeline with important events in Lorenzo Milani's life and his school in Barbiana. Add images, videos, and short descriptions that explain the historical context and significance of these events. Pay attention to the inclusive elements.

Activity

- Create an interactive timeline with events such as the founding of the school in Barbiana, Milani's publication "Letter to a Teacher" and important milestones of inclusion work.
- Supplement the timeline with historical images, videos, and context-related quiz questions for each event.
- As an assignment, write a blog post or create a presentation about how a similar project could be implemented today.

2. Virtual Classroom Barbiana Description: Create a 3D model of Barbiana's classroom that students can explore. The model should represent the arrangement of tables, collaborative learning, and the use of books.

Activity

- Develop the model as a replica of an inclusive classroom with concrete details such as seating arrangements, learning materials used, and didactic posters.
- Participants can explore the model by solving tasks, such as "Find the book that formed the basis for the discussion about social justice".
- Additionally, simulate a lesson where participants use digital tools to design an inclusive teaching task.

3. Discussion Platform: Inclusive Teaching Design Description: Lead a moderated discussion about the transferability of Lorenzo Milani's principles to today's teaching concepts.

Activity
